## Worldcon Bid: Kansas City

What are the proposed dates for which you are bidding? August 17-21, 2016

What is your proposed convention host city? Is your convention site in a city center location or a suburb? If a suburb, what are the transport options into the city center? How far is the site from the city center? Downtown Kansas City, Missouri

What is the typical current airfare to your closest airport from world cities such as London, Boston, Chicago, Los Angeles, Melbourne?

- London: \$1,424
- Boston: \$362
- Chicago: \$214
- Los Angeles: \$419
- Melbourne: \$1,548

Do international flights, as well as domestic, fly into your local airport? Which airlines? If not, where is the closest international airport? Are direct flights from the cities above flown into your local airport?

Kansas City International (MCI) is an international airport, but for practical purposes almost all flights, internationally, will be via connections.

## How far is your convention site from the nearest airport/train station and what is the likely cost of getting to the hotels by both public transport and taxi from that airport/train station?

- 19 Miles (30.5 km) to KCI (~20 minutes)
  - Super Shuttle:\$18.00 per person (Shared Ride up to 10 persons), Taxi: \$49
- 1.5 Miles (2.4 km) to the main Amtrak station (\$9.00 Taxi)

See above for rates. Breakfast is doubtful for downtown hotels. Internet is still in negotiation, but, Kansas City (Missouri and Kansas) is the site for the rollout of Google Fiber. They have begun installation and anticipate finishing by the end of 2013.

#### What is the cost to \*park\* at the convention/hotel facilities?

Unknown, but, not egregious. (Still in Negotiation but less than \$20 per day)

Main hotel is ½ block, all others are within 2 Standard Blocks.

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Pretty Standard. No smoking in public places, all of the Hotels are non-smoking.
